SUEZ SIGNS A CONTRACT WITH THE CITY OF MLAWA IN POLAND FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MUNICIPAL SEWAGE TREATMENT INFRASTRUCTURE

SUEZ and the Mayor of MLAWA city signed on July 1st 2016 a 33 year contract for the management of the city sewage treatment infrastructure. By signing this contract, worth €77 million, the city of Mlawa entrusts SUEZ to:

- Operate the existing waste water treatment plant for 3 years;
- Design, Build, Finance the new waste water treatment plant within 3 years;
- Operate the newly built infrastructure for 30 years.

Considering that the existing waste water treatment plant, originally built in 1991, became overtime obsolete in terms of technology, the City of Mlawa has chosen SUEZ for the construction and operation of its new waste water treatment plant (WWTP).

The new WWTP, to be commissioned within 3 years, will have the capacity of 5200 m³/day and will enable the City of Mlawa to meet all quality standards required by the Polish law thanks to the new technology and innovations provided by SUEZ. The group will implement processes that will further remove pollutants dissolved in the waste water such as organic carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus compounds and have a considerable impact on improving the cleanliness of the environment, especially on the Seracz river located in the vicinity.

Angel Simon, Deputy Chief Executive Officer of SUEZ in charge of Water Europe says: *"We are delighted to partner with the city of Mlawa. The operational and environmental stewardship of SUEZ will ensure tangible benefits for the city and its residents. Our commitment to help with the modernization of infrastructure will enable the municipality to guarantee high-quality essential services for all of its citizens."*

With this new contract in the water sector in Poland together with the ongoing project in Poznan in the energy-from-waste sector, SUEZ demonstrates its willingness to offer its expertise to the Polish local authorities in the management of their resources"
