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SUEZ LAUNCHES ONETWOTRI: AN ONLINE SERVICE FOR COMPANIES IN READINESS FOR THE APPLICATION OF NEW REGULATIONS AND TO ASSESS THEIR DEGREE OF COMPLIANCE IN WASTE RECOVERY

The Energy Transition law for green growth will come into effect on 1 July 2016. This new regulation will have a direct impact on businesses and administrations that produce more than 1,100 litres of waste per week and per site.

With www.OneTwoTri.suez.fr, SUEZ is launching a new online service to help professionals to assess their level of compliance and to get ready for the application of this new regulation.

OneTwoTri, which is already online, is the only personalised service that offers professionals:

- comprehensive information on the new obligations to sort and recover their waste flows,
- an assessment of their compliance in just a few clicks.

This online service is designed for all types of organisations, from very small businesses to SMEs, major groups and administrations that are affected by the new regulation. In particular, it addresses the sorting at source of the five waste flows (organic waste, plastics, paper and cardboard, glass and metals), which must be recovered and traced more stringently under the terms of the new regulation.

This online service, which can be used on a smartphone or a tablet, is made smoother and easier to use by "Suzie", a virtual advisor who helps web users to find the information they are looking for. After completing a short questionnaire, users receive a personalised assessment of waste management in their organisation.

If they are not compliant with the new regulations, users can request assistance from a nearby SUEZ advisor, who will propose a made-to-measure and compliant solution. Thanks to its strong presence in the regions and the renowned expertise of its staff; SUEZ will be able to deliver the most suitable solution.
