- **ANA GIROS IS APPOINTED CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE LATIN AMERICA BUSINESS UNIT**
- **FABRICE ROSSIGNOL IS APPOINTED CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE ITALY, CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE AND CIS BUSINESS UNIT**
- **PIERRE-YVES POULIQUEN IS APPOINTED CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE AFRICA, MIDDLE-EAST AND INDIA BUSINESS UNIT**

**As of 1st January 2017, Ana Giros was appointed as Chief Executive Officer of the new Latin America Business Unit and Fabrice Rossignol as Chief Executive Officer of the Italy, Central and Eastern Europe and CIS Business Unit of SUEZ. Pierre-Yves Pouliquen was appointed Chief Executive Officer of the Africa, Middle East and India Business Unit on 1st March 2017.**



Ana Giros joined the SUEZ Group in October 2015 as Chief Executive Officer of the Europe-Latin America Business Unit. She was previously CEO of Alstom Transport France. In her new position, Ana Giros will be in charge of the integrated management and development of all the Group's Water & Waste activities for municipal and industrial clients in several countries in Latin America, including Chile, Brazil, Colombia and Mexico. Ana Giros will also be responsible for developing the Industrial Water Europe activities and the Global Business Line Industrial Solutions.

Aged 42, Ana Giros is an engineer, a graduate of the Polytechnic University of Barcelona and INSEAD.

Before taking up his new position, Fabrice Rossignol was Senior Executive Vice President of the France Recycling & Recovery Business Unit and Chief Executive Officer of Industrial Waste Specialties (dangerous waste). After joining the Group in 1998, he successively held several positions as Head of Mergers and Acquisitions of the SITA Group, Senior Executive Vice President of SITA Scandinavia, CEO of SUEZ Environnement Central Europe and then Chief Operating Officer of SUEZ Environnement Central Europe, Mediterranean, Middle East. In particular, Fabrice Rossignol will be in charge of developing, with his team, SUEZ's markets with local authorities and industrial clients in Italy, Central and Eastern Europe. Fabrice Rossignol, 52, is a graduate of ESSEC.





Pierre-Yves Pouliquen was Deputy CEO of the Africa, Middle East and India Business Unit since 2013. He joined the Group in 1995, where he served in various entities of SITA as Financial Director, Regional Director and CEO before joining Degrémont in 2007 to lead the Europe Business Line and Service business. Pierre-Yves Pouliquen's mission will be to further strengthen the impact and presence of all SUEZ businesses in the Middle East, North Africa and India, and to develop the Group's footprint in Sub-Saharan Africa.

Pierre-Yves Pouliquen, 53, is a graduate of HEC.

Ana Giros Calpe joins the teams managed by Angel Simon, Group Senior Executive Vice President in charge of Water Europe. Fabrice Rossignol and Pierre-Yves Pouliquen join those of Marie-Ange Debon, Group Senior Executive Vice-President in charge of the International Division. They join the Executive Committee of SUEZ.
